

Information for doctoral researchers of the Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences and of the Medical Faculty of Heinrich Heine University Düsseldorf

According to their respective doctoral regulations, doctoral researchers of the Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (FMNS) and of the Medical Faculty (MedF) of Heinrich Heine University (HHU) Düsseldorf are obliged to complete a course in *Good Scientific Practice* (GSP, i.e. research integrity) at their according faculty. GSP courses, offered by JuDocs at Forschungszentrum Jülich, can be recognised for this purpose, as long as they correspond in scope and content to the GSP courses of HHU <u>and</u> if all important HHU-specific regulations are taken into account.

For possible recognition, please read those regulations and linked documents, listed below, that concern you and your doctoral project. You confirm that you have read and understood these, by signing this form. Please submit this confirmation together with the confirmation of course participation to the doctorate office of your according faculty.

1. General Information for all doctoral researchers of HHU:

1.1 Binding regulations that affect all doctoral researchers of HHU:

1.1.1 Central GSP-Regulation of HHU

To safeguard good scientific practice (GSP), Heinrich Heine Universiy (HHU) Düsseldorf has issued the following regulation, which applies to all members of the HHU, thus also to doctoral researchers of HHU without exception. You will find these via the following link:

1.1.2 GSP Ombudspersons of the Faculties and Central Investigation Commission

In case of GSP-relevant questions and/or in case of suspicion of possible scientific misconduct members of HHU may confidentially contact the GSP ombudsperson of their respective faculty. The central investigation commission of the HHU is responsible for investigating allegations of possible scientific misconduct against scientists currently or formerly working at the HHU. 2. Specific instructions for doctoral researchers of the Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (FMNS) of HHU

2.1 Important Information on Doctoral Research at FMNS of HHU:

Doctoral research projects at FMNS must follow the valid doctoral regulations of the faculty (available on the websites of the faculty's doctorate office). Please pay particular attention to application deadlines and requirements for doctoral projects and the doctorate specified in the regulations, including mandatory requirements for the supervision of doctoral research projects, e.g. mentoring the doctorate by a mentor, preparation of a supervision agreement and of annual progress reports.

The faculty provides you with forms (see links below) for the preparation of mandatory supervision agreement and progress reports. These forms meet all requirements of the doctoral regulations. For members of iGRAD (cf. 2.3), modified versions are available, taking into account the iGRAD basic curriculum:

- Supervision agreement for doctoral students (without iGRAD membership)
- Progress reports for doctoral candidates (without iGRAD membership)
- Supervision agreement for doctoral iGRAD members
- Progress reports for doctoral iGRAD members

For all questions concerning doctoral matters and the doctorate procedure, please contact the doctoral office of FMNS.

In the event of possible conflicts, the <u>iGRAD-Office</u> and the <u>Vice-Dean of FMNS</u> are available to doctoral researchers and their supervisors as a confidential contact point.

2.2 Binding Regulations for all Doctoral Theses at FMNS:

Doctoral researchers at FMNS are also obliged to observe the rules on the prevention of plagiarism when writing their dissertation. These are available via the following link:

2.3 Supplementary information on services offered by iGRAD:

All doctoral researchers at FMNS can become members of iGRAD and complete a <u>supplementary curriculum in key professional qualifications</u> during the course of their doctoral research. After successful completion of the doctorate and of iGRAD's basic curriculum, members can receive a <u>doctorate transcript</u> listing courses completed and other qualification-relevant achievements from the doctoral period. In addition, iGRAD members can use offers in <u>career counselling and other services</u> of iGRAD.

If the main supervisor of the doctoral project is occupied at FMNS, MedF or the IUF (i.e. employed by HHU), participation in courses in the iGRAD basic curriculum is free of charge.

3. Specific instructions for doctoral researchers of the Medical Faculty (MedF) of HHU

3.1 Important Information on Doctoral Research at MedF of HHU

3.1.1 Declaration of Commitment to Patient Data Protection

If (doctoral) researcher inspect patient records or work with personal data in the course of their (non-)medical work, the responsible project leaders must have a commitment to patient's data protection signed by these (doctoral) researchers. 3.1.2 Additional Regulations for Doctoral Researchers at MedF of HHU

Doctoral research projects at FMNS must follow the valid doctoral regulations for medical doctoral degrees or the PhD degree of MedF. Doctoral projects must always be registered with the Medical Research School Düsseldorf in the Graduate Centre of Medicine. Please note the registration deadlines and requirements specified in the respective regulations, as well as the obligatory requirements for the supervision of doctoral studies, e.g. the supervision of the doctoral studies by a co-supervisor, the preparation of a project outline, the submission of any necessary votes of ethics commissions or animal experiment approval and the timely submission of progress reports.

The faculty provides doctoral students of medicine and the PhD program with all relevant documents and regulations in the <u>download centre of the Graduate Centre</u>.

For all questions concerning the registration of the doctoral project, the respective training programme and the doctorate procedure, you can contact the <u>Central Doctoral Office in the Graduate Centre of Medicine</u>.

In case of possible conflicts, the Graduate Centre of Medicine and the ombudsperson of the Faculty of Medicine are also available as confidential contact points for doctoral students and their supervisors.



4. HHU-specific information on research data management, research on humans, research on animals and data protection relevant aspects

4.1 Research Data Management at HHU:

4.2 Research on Humans:

In case of research projects on humans (i.e. on and with humans (including deceased persons), research with human body material, and research during which privacy relevant data of humans is collected or evaluated), it must first be checked whether a positive vote of an ethics committee exists, or whether it is required by existing laws and regulations (for research projects at the Medical Faculty this generally is the case). If no required positive vote exists, it must be obtained prior to the start of any research activity.

All members of HHU can contact the **Ethics Committee of the Medical Faculty of HHU** for the ethical and legal evaluation of such research projects and for advice on these issues. Further information is available on the web pages of the ethics committee under the following link:

Members of the Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences can also seek advice on "non-invasive" research projects on humans for which no mandatory ethics vote is required (e.g. certain research projects in psychology). 4.3 Research on Animals:

In case of research projects involving animals, it must be checked prior to the start of any research activities, whether the prerequisites are fulfilled and whether corresponding notification or authorisation requirements and qualification obligations have been fulfilled.
